What is a blizzard? By NSIDC "Officially the National Weather Service defines a blizzard as large amounts of falling or blowing snow with winds in excess of 35 mph and visibility of less than 25 miles. For more than 3 hours."

"Blizzard" entered vocabularies when German settlers in Iowa brought the word to us. Coming from the word blitzartig, meaning "lightning-like." European pioneers and settlers in the snow belt of the U.S. were astounded by the severity of the winters. Although accustomed to snow in their home countries, they were newly confronted with driving winds and freezing weather characteristic of the mid-west. **NSIDC**

What is the NSIDC? NASA National Snow and Ice Data Center established in 1976 advances knowledge of the Earth's frozen regions. They specialize on frozen ground, glaciers and ice sheets.
